I am pleased to recommend Mr. Mohammed Arham Rafi for admission to your university. I taught him in my “Command Z: AI for Gen Z” bootcamp during the summer of 2025, organized by Futures Abroad. In that setting, I observed his work ethic, creativity, and character at close range.

Arham is the student you notice on day one. He takes initiative, asks precise questions, and follows curiosity with action. He consistently went beyond the assigned work, turning open-ended prompts into tangible concepts with clear next steps. He approaches problems like an entrepreneur, not waiting for permission to build, test, and iterate.

During the workshop Arham conceived and presented **Edrizz**, a student support concept aimed at helping learners prepare for the SAT and navigate college applications. He framed the idea around real student pain points, described a practical feature roadmap, and explained how to keep a human in the loop for quality control and ethical guardrails. His pitch was clear, data-minded, and audience aware.

Arham’s performance earned formal recognition. He received the **Individual award: “Human in the Loop”**, reflecting his grasp of responsible AI practices and his ability to integrate human judgment into automated workflows. He also shared the **Team award: “Best Collaboration”**, which speaks to his reliability, respect for peers, and steady presence in group problem-solving. These were competitive honors, and he earned them through substance, not showmanship.

Beyond awards, Arham stands out for grit and follow-through. He sought feedback early, revised promptly, and helped classmates troubleshoot their projects without neglecting

his own. He communicates professionally, meets deadlines, and treats challenges as chances to learn. In my experience, those habits predict success better than any single test score.

Arham is a natural leader, and the world always needs more of those. He is poised to be part of the next generation guiding society successfully into the future.
